Welcome!

The newness of spring, especially in northeast Ohio, always signals beginnings. This year it seems more potent than most, after enduring the pandemic for so long. This season's exhibitions bring a hopeful and lighthearted quality to some deeper subjects.

Cycling by Micah Kraus does a fabulous job of setting the tone with its explosion of color and texture, repetition, and playful pondering about the meaning of life. While his body of work is not directly about the pandemic, I can't help but think that it resonates with what we've all experienced since March 2020: cycles of emotions and questions, telling ourselves we are "OK!", and the repetition of time passing. Yet even with the weight of these subjects, there is an overall tone of hope and renewal.

This theme of "renewal through repetition" plays out through the entire exhibition season, underscored by a focus on the practices of printmaking, collage, and weaving. *StarBurst*, the inaugural Summit County high school exhibition, sheds light on the concepts of repetition and renewal as seniors emerge into a new phase of their lives. The importance of repetition for young artists—through the

process of constantly creating —is vital to developing an artistic practice. In the 25th Annual Small Format Exhibition by the National Collage Society, you will find that collage offers novel ways of viewing familiar imagery from media like magazines and newspapers.

The group exhibition *Unnatural Fibers* is all about giving new life to traditional, repetitive fiber processes by using non-traditional materials and technology. Through weaving and quilting, the artists tackle relevant subjects such as gender and immigration, yet these are balanced by pieces that stand out for their playful use of color and pattern. When We Share Our Wounds by Nick Lee brings up a vital conversation about representation. Viewing multiple large-scale portraits featuring Asian Americans helps to renew and reclaim traditional portraiture, where we are accustomed to seeing white subjects. Lee's use of his own likeness along with family and friends' faces in a semi-surreal way brings a playful touch to an important message.

As you visit, I hope you take away the idea that repetition—especially done in a lighthearted way can bring us comfort, joy, and renewal.

About Summit Artspace

Summit Artspace is a nonprofit arts organization that strives to support artists throughout every step of the creative process. Located in the Historic Arts District in downtown Akron, it is a hub for artists and arts supporters to connect and share ideas. With affordable studio spaces available to artists and creative organizations, the building is bustling with inspiration at every corner. Four times each year, Summit Artspace rotates exhibitions in its five galleries, allowing the public to access incredible art for free. It also coordinates public programs, such as ArtWalk, which engage the community with art and local creators.

About the Building

Summit Artspace's historic building has been an Akron landmark since 1927 when it was commissioned by **John S.** and **James L. Knight** as the new headquarters of the *Akron Beacon Journal*. Standing three stories tall and boasting a whopping 55,000 square feet, the building has been an epicenter of excitement and creativity for nearly a century. On November 10, 1927, U.S. **President Calvin Coolidge** started the paper presses using a telegraph key in the White House. 20,000 visitors attended the three-day housewarming event that followed. The Knight brothers relocated the *Beacon Journal* in 1938 and the Akron Public Library purchased the building in 1940. It was used as the library's main location until 1969. Small manufacturing companies used the building until 1976 when it was purchased by Summit County. Summit County

has previously leased the building to the Historical Society, the MRDD board, and the Akron Work Center. The building is now leased by Summit Artspace and is enjoyed by resident artists, creative organizations, and the public. The building retains many of its original features, including a manually-operated freight elevator, John S. Knight's safe, and of course, the ornate art-deco façade.

FACES OF AKRON

Through a grant from the Ohio Arts Council, Summit Artspace will restore, document, and expand the *Kings and Queens* mural in the building's parking lot.

In 2006, artist **Kirk Mangus** (1952–2013) and 25 Summit County teens painted the mural, which represents the various ethnic groups living in Akron.

Artist **Eva Kwong**, Mangus' widow, will spearhead the restoration of the mural aided by student artists in the Akron Public Schools' School of the Arts and Academy of Design.

A new community-based digital mural initiative led by local artist **Alexandria Couch**, titled *Faces of Akron*, will pay homage to the 2006 mural. Couch selected five artists—**Meryl Engler**, **Hope Hickman**, **Micah Kraus**, **Christine Ries**, and **Sylvia Sykes**—to create portraits of Akron community members in their own artistic styles. The portraits will be exhibited at Summit Artspace in June 2022.

Additionally, community portraits will be featured in a digital mural on Summit Artspace's website.
