I'm excited to announce that Summit Artspace is debuting new names for three of our galleries. The Intersections Gallery, Forum Gallery, and Horizon Gallery reflect both the physical locations of the spaces within our building and our recent gallery alignment plan, designed so that artists of diverse abilities at specific milestones in their careers have a place to show their work. As you move about the building discovering our new exhibitions, I hope you take notice!

This fall, themes of place and belonging run through our galleries. The signature juried exhibition, *Kaleidoscope*, is celebrating its 20th year. This show features artists from our local arts networks and organizations (Akron Society of Artists, Artists of Rubber City, Cuyahoga Valley Art Center, Women's Art League). Many of the works in this year's show highlight some sense of place through landscape painting, architectural photography, and conceptual assemblage—just to name a few. Another member exhibition, *Working Through Time*, highlights how the Artists of Group Ten have come together in unique ways over the course of the collective's history.

The other exhibitions feature an exciting array of these themes. In the Welcome Gallery, **Sarah Nolan** explores utopia—an idealized form of place—through her colorful, sculptural monoprints. The Forum Gallery's *Caught Up in Branches* examines urban plant life in our city, through **Avery Mags Duff's** paintings and **Matt Kurtz**'s video performance, installation, and photography. **Mike Alejandro**'s solo exhibition in the Horizon Gallery investigates the intersection of personal and historical narratives in large-scale paintings grounded in place and belonging as an immigrant, drawing from his Venezuelan culture.

These concepts of place and belonging are a wonderful reminder about the purpose behind Summit Artspace itself—to connect YOU with local artists. When you visit these exhibitions and purchase artwork (a wonderful gift this holiday season), you are in fact telling these artists that THEY belong here. We are grateful for your engagement and support.





About Summit Artspace

Summit Artspace is a nonprofit arts organization that strives to support artists throughout every step of the creative process. Located in the Historic Arts District in downtown Akron, it is a hub for artists and arts supporters to connect and share ideas. With affordable studio spaces available to artists and creative organizations, the building is bustling with inspiration at every corner. Four times each year, Summit Artspace rotates exhibitions in its five galleries, allowing the public to access incredible art for free. It also coordinates public programs, such as ArtWalk, which engage the community with art and local creators.

Summit County is recognized nationwide as a place where artists thrive.







About the Building

Summit Artspace's historic building has been an Akron landmark since 1927 when it was commissioned by **John S.** and **James L. Knight** as the new headquarters of the *Akron Beacon Journal*. Standing three stories tall and boasting a whopping 55,000 square feet, the building has been an epicenter of excitement and creativity for nearly a century. On November 10, 1927, U.S. **President Calvin Coolidge** started the paper presses using a telegraph key in the White House. 20,000 visitors attended the three-day housewarming event that followed. The Knight brothers relocated the *Beacon Journal* in 1938 and the Akron Public Library purchased the building in 1940. It was used as the library's main location until 1969. Small manufacturing companies used the building until 1976 when it was purchased

by Summit County. Summit County has previously leased the building to the Historical Society, the MRDD board, and the Akron Work Center. The building is now leased by Summit Artspace and is enjoyed by resident artists, creative organizations, and the public. The building retains many of its original features, including a manually-operated freight elevator, John S. Knight's safe, and of course, the ornate art-deco façade.
